













Overview

Maze Land consists of three themes of mazes, and a museum where numerous types of puzzles from around world are displayed. Two maze courses await you. You may choose either a beginner or advanced level maze. Please ring the bell once you successfully exit a maze.

Dolmiro, or Maze of Whinstone

In Jeju, *olle* refers to the narrow path between the street and one's doorstep, each side of which lies a stone wall.

This maze is created in the image of *Dol Harubangs* which are large stone statues found everywhere on Jeju island, erected as guardian spirits. Around 100,000 pieces of basalt stone were used to build the *olle* here. Plus, the water fog should be added to your must-see list for the maze.

Barammiro, or Maze of Wind

This maze resembles a shape of typhoon in the region of Crete island, Greece, the origin of the maze.

The arborvitae trees lining the paths through the maze will keep your spirit refreshed and uplifted.

Yeojamiro, or Maze of Women

This maze is modeled after a Jeju *haenyo* woman diver, especially making her way to home after diving for shellfish. To empathize with the real life of Jeju women, be sure to visit this woodsy fragrance-filled place with common camellias in full blossom.

Maze Puzzle Museum

There are plenty of puzzles exhibited here. As a global mega-hit product ever since the 14 Century, puzzles will grab your attention and ultimately lead you to try your hand. There are other places to see, as well, such as media rooms, special exhibit halls, and a room called Maze of Knowledge.

Aejiang

This is a woodland which has become a popular destination for forest bathing travelers. *Castanopsis* trees mostly over 40 years old inhabit there. Please have a pleasant forest bathing trip while walking along these trails, the lifelong achievement of the founder of Maze Land. Do not miss the chance to appreciate the beautifully crafted works by *Jang Gong-ik*, a maestro in stone artwork. His works are inspired by the local myths of the island of Jeju.
